Registered aerogramme sent from Shorncliffe, QL April 24, 1960 to **München, Germany.**

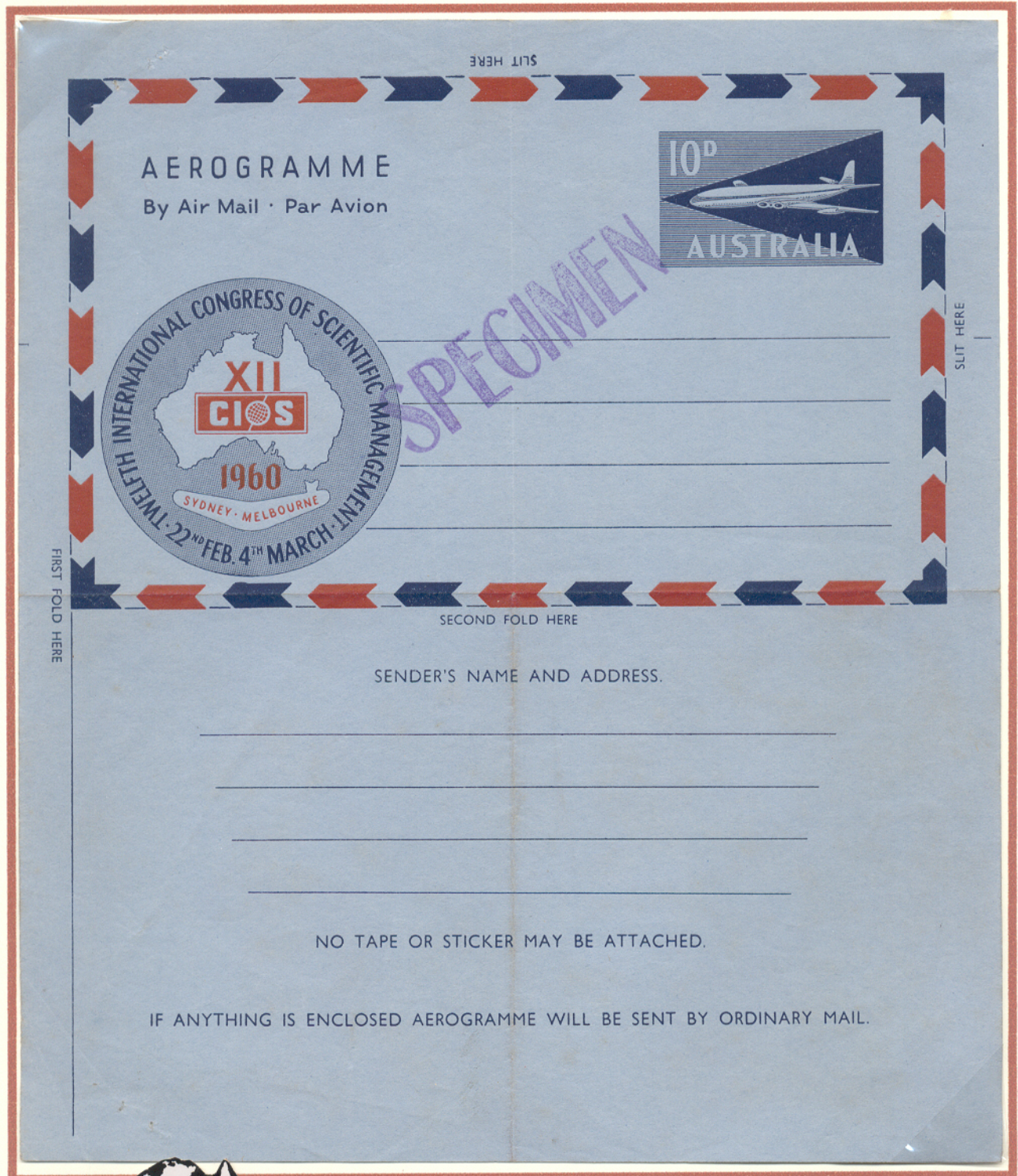
**Additional registration: October 1, 1959 up to decimal period: 2/-.**

### EMBLEM PROOF



Aerogramme with capitals with **SPECIMEN** in violet, length 62 mm, for Postmaster General Department.



This aerogramme and symbol for the congress were designed by C.M. Gray.  
This is the specimen submitted by the Post Office via P Collas.

 CIOS emblem in lower left.  
 Blue and red printing on azure paper.  
 First day August 5, 1959.



This aerogramme was issued to commemorate the 12<sup>th</sup> International Congress of Scientific Management, held in Sydney from February 22 to March 4, 1960. The species was issued initially, as announced in the ABP, for a period of six weeks, and also made available during the period of the Congress.  
 The design is an adaptation of the previous one. The only modifications are the addition of the circular Congress emblem at the left of the front panel, and the extension of the address lines, now undotted.

Aerogramme overprinted in open capitals with **SPECIMEN** in red, length 42 mm, for UPU.



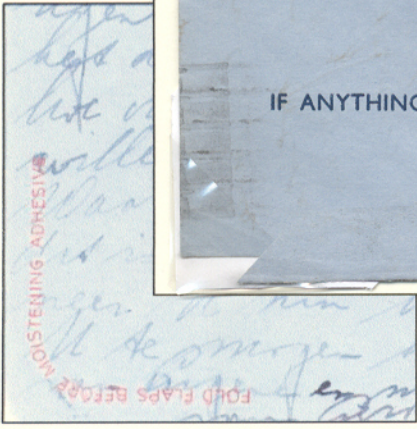
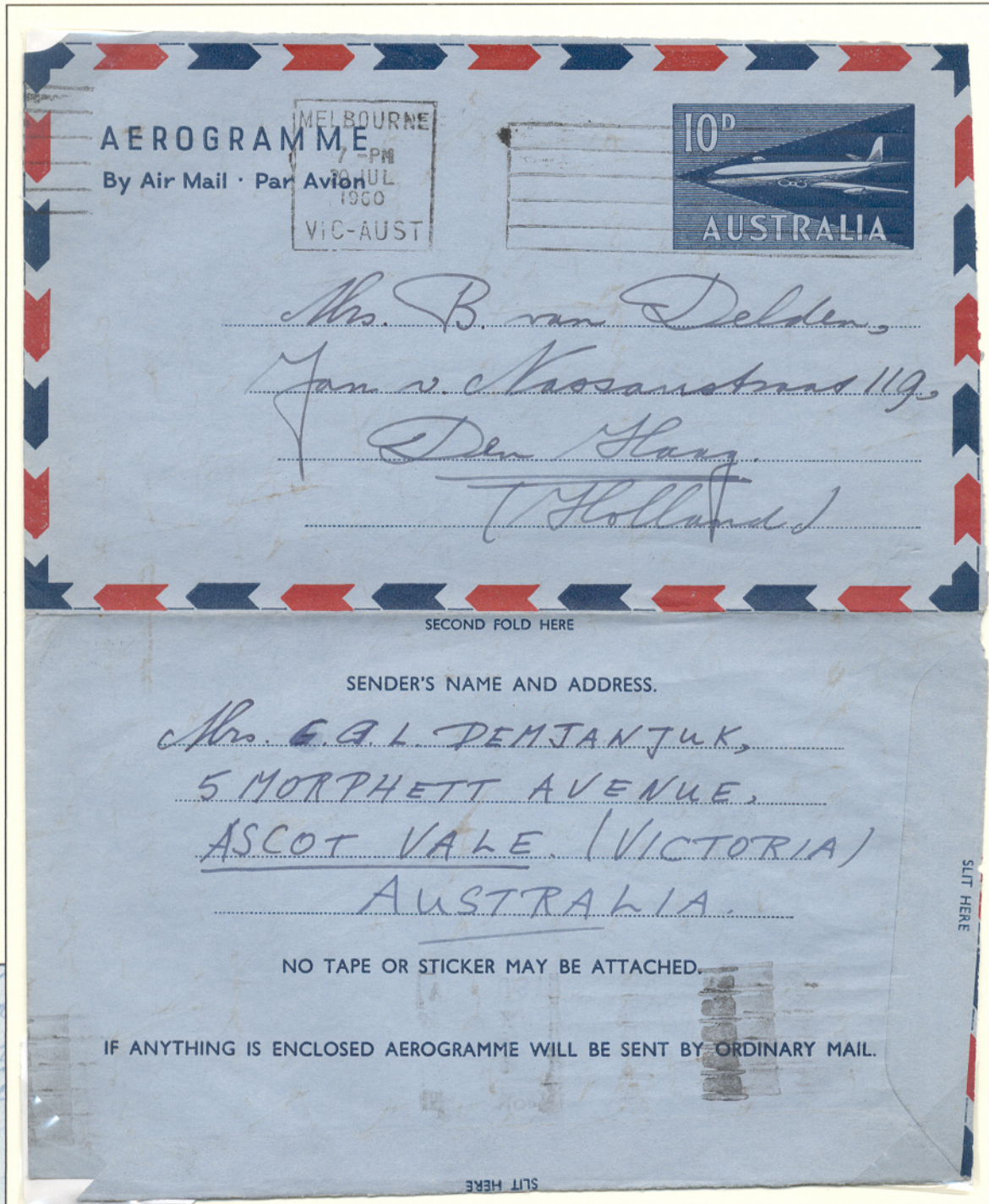
The indicium differs from the previous one in several minor aspects. The "10d" and "AUSTRALIA" are not outlined in blue. The upper and lower triangles are noticeable lighter.  
 The top row of the shading along the bottom of the plane is broken into a series of dots (windows).

First day October 21, 1959.



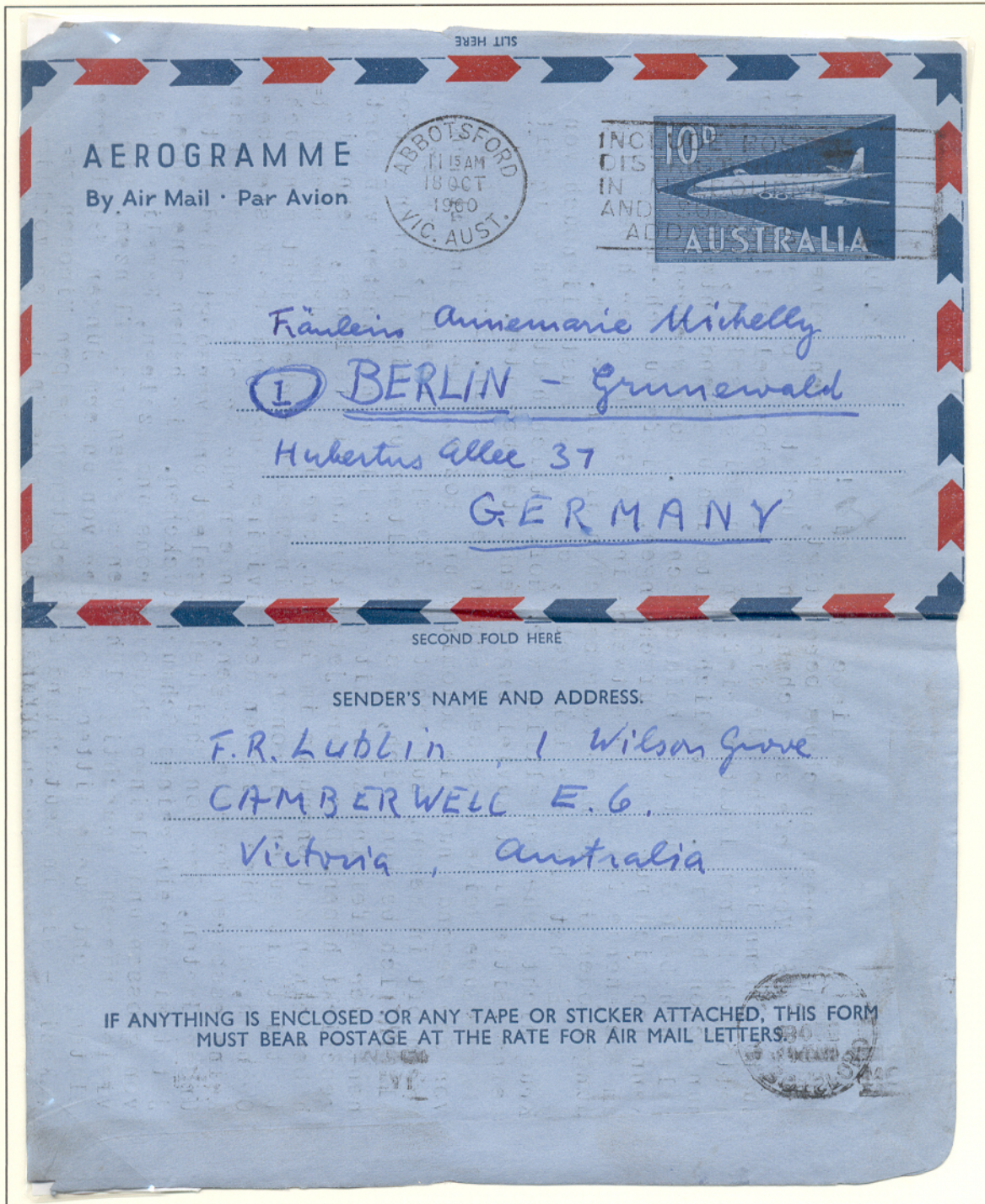
Aerogramme sent from Melbourne July 20, 1960 to **Den Haag, The Netherlands.**

This aerogramme differs from the latter by addition of the red printed folding directions  
- **FOLD FLAPS BEFORE MOISTENING ADHESIVE** -  
in roman, sans serif capital letters in the upper left corner of the writing panel. No difference can be seen on sealed examples.

Aerogramme sent from Abbotsford October 18, 1960 to **Berlin, Germany**.

Two line admonition now closely spaced and start with: **IF ANYTHING IS ENCLOSED OR ANY STICKER ATTACHED.....**



## AEROGRAMMES

10 - pence Qantas 40 years of Service commemorative aerogramme.  
Emblem in lower left.  
Blue and red printing on azure paper.  
First day October 12, 1960.



Aerogramme overprinted in open capitals with **SPECIMEN** in red, length 105 mm for U.P.U..



A round the world flight to commemorate the 40 year of Qantas service sent November 16, 1960 to **Norfolk Island** December 4, 1960.  
An extra stamp of 10d had to be affixed to pay the proper rate for this special service.  
Also commemorative machine cancellation with ditto flag.

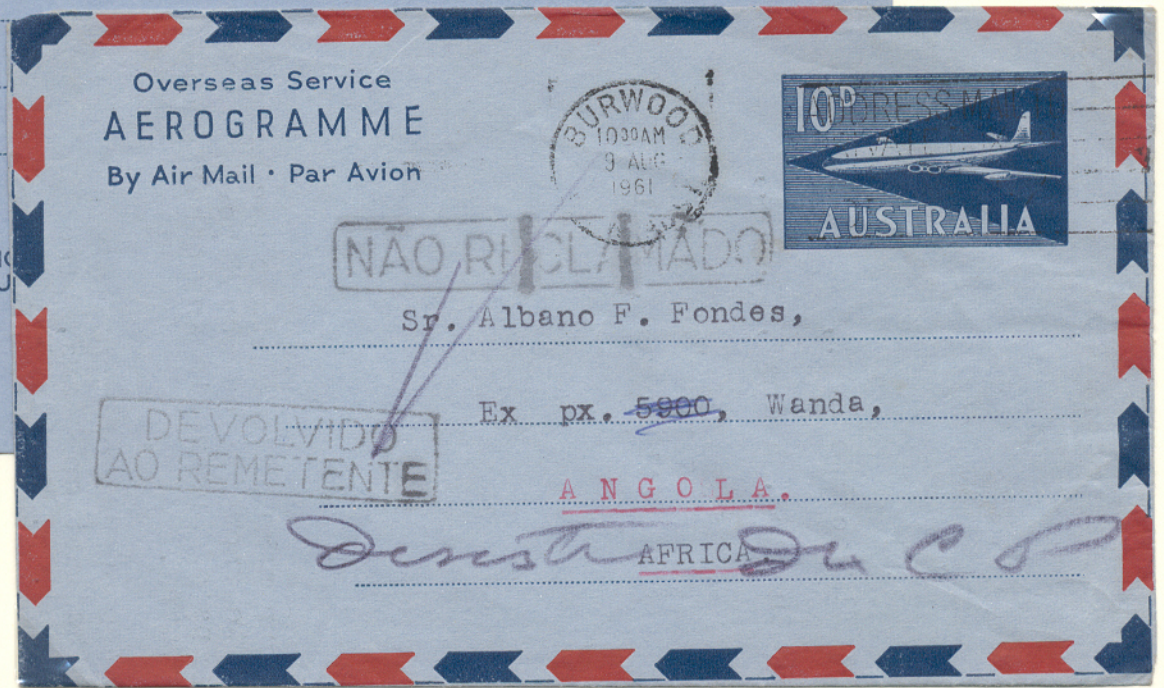

First day December 15, 1960.

Again, to meet the public's desire for copies of this aerogramme, copies were placed on sale at 6d. These were similarly hand stamped "SPECIMEN" in purple. Following decimalization on February 14, 1966, they were sold at 5c. They were taken off sale about six months later.

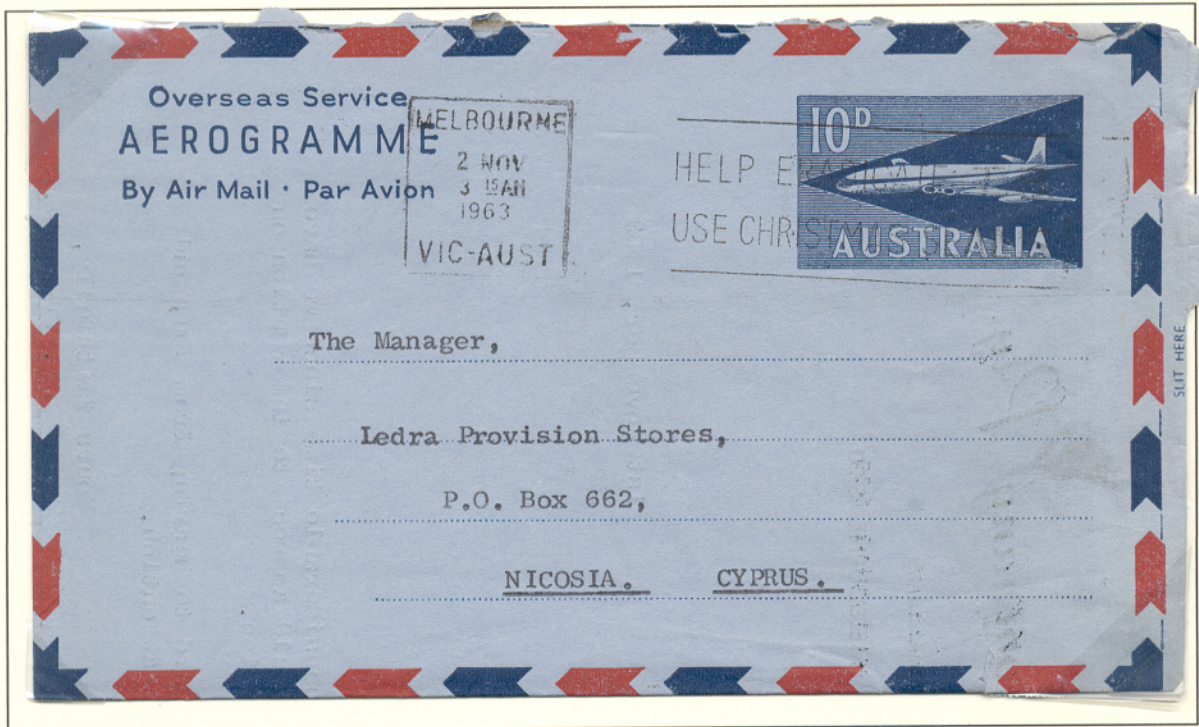

Aerogramme sent from Burwood, New South Wales, August 9, 1961 to **Wanda, Angola.**  
With boxed **NÃO RECLAMADO** and **DEVOLVIDO/AO REMETENTE**. Returned to sender.

Aerogramme sent from Melbourne November 2, 1963 to **Nicosia, Cyprus.**



Aerogramme sent from North Sydney May 19, 1966 to **Sidney, OHIO - USA.**

After the introduction of **Decimal currency**, February 14, 1966, the new rate for an Aerogramme was 9 cent. The old 10 penny Aerogramme had a face value of 8 cents so an extra 1 cent stamp had to be affixed to full do the postal rate.
